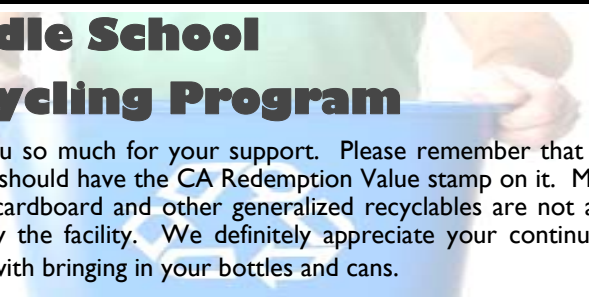
Garden Update
