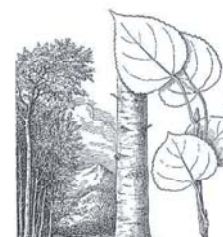
On the CMP website, there are several activities and games available online to help with math facts and other mathematical concepts (<http://cacmp.org/dev/Math-links/math-links.htm>).
