

What to Bring:

- _____ 1. In an envelope marked with student's name place **\$15.00 cash** for dinner Tuesday night. Chaperones will be asked to carry their groups' envelopes and have an envelope for themselves as well.
- _____ 2. In an envelope marked with student's name place for gas money for drivers (\$5-\$10).
- _____ 3. We suggest a small amount of spending money for snacks, etc.

Packing List: Remember vehicles are fairly full & we are asking students to bring one **small** bag each. The weather is anticipated to be about 70 degrees in the day and 50 degrees in the evening, so layers are suggested. We will also be out on the ocean for whale watching and will want to be prepared for sea air and the prevention of sea sickness.

On Tuesday, please wear clothes to work in for the ranch/farm: long pants, closed-toed shoes, etc.

Sea sickness: Getting sea sick is not fun. There are many options to avoid sea sickness if you or your student gets sea sick. Please prepare for this possibility in the way you choose. Consulting a doctor is always recommended. If a student will be bringing sea sickness medications please have them in a bag clearly labeled in original packaging with their names and direction as to usage. We will be asking a parent chaperone/teacher to be responsible for caring for these items should you send them.

What not to bring: Do not bring anything you aren't allowed to have at school.
No electronics allowed.
Cell phones will be allowed, but held by a chaperone/teacher.
Camera, binoculars, etc. are allowed, but are brought at your own risk.
