What is CMP?

The California Montessori Project is a tuition-free public charter school network made up of seven campuses in the greater Sacramento area:

- Capitol (Sacramento)
- Carmichael
- Elk Grove Elk Grove

- Orangevale
- Shingle Springs



What is a Charter School?

- CMP is an Independent Charter authorized by four local school districts (San Juan, Sacramento City, Elk Grove, and Buckeye Union School District)
 - Allows alternate teaching methods. (Montessori Philosophy & Curriculum)
 - Oversight by Governing Board: Comprised of parents, teachers, and community members
 - Funded directly by the state through tax dollars
 - Develops own budget
 - Responsible for California State Common Core Standards

Educational Program and Philosophy

- Students learn through use of special manipulative Montessori materials
- Develops critical thinking skills
- Our curriculum is carefully aligned with the California Common Core Standards
- Students work at their own pace
- Students work independently and in small groups
- Students are empowered to manage their daily independent work
- Teachers continually assess and monitor student progress (formally and informally)





The Montessori Classroom

- Students work at group or individual tables, or on small work rugs on the floor




